## Course Description

Calling all kids! This engaging course introduces students (ages 7–12) to Koine Greek—the language of the Greco-Roman world. Through songs, games, hands-on activities, and gentle instruction, students will begin learning the same foundational concepts as a full Greek course, just at a slower, age-appropriate pace.

This program is designed as a **two-part course** (separate semester and registration), allowing students to build a strong and confident foundation in the language while enjoying the process.

## Course Details

- **When:** Wednesdays, 10:00–11:30 AM (1.5 hours)
  - **Dates:** August 18 – November 19 (Part 1), January 13 – April 27 (Part 2)
  - **Where:** East Anchorage
  - **Who:** Ages 7–12 (must be able to read and write in English)
  - **Meets:** Once per week for 14 weeks

## **Program Structure (Two Parts)**

### **Part 1: Foundations**

Students will be introduced to:

- Greek alphabet & pronunciation
- Basic vocabulary
- Introduction to nouns and simple sentence structure
- Early reading practice

### **Part 2: Building Skills**

Students will continue with:

- Expanded vocabulary
- Verb concepts and sentence building
- More advanced grammar concepts (age-appropriate)
- Increased reading and understanding of simple passages

---

## **What Students Will Learn**

Over both parts, students will:

- Read and write the Greek alphabet with confidence
- Recognize and use foundational vocabulary
- Understand basic noun and verb patterns
- Begin reading and understanding simple Greek sentences
- Gain a strong foundation for future Greek study

## **Class Structure**

Each class includes:

- Interactive teaching
  - Songs and repetition for memory
  - Games and hands-on activities
  - Reading and writing practice
  - Gentle review and encouragement

## Homework & Expectations

- Optional light practice at home (5–10 minutes a few days a week)
    - The practice you put in at home, the more the student will excel in Greek
  - Focus on exposure and enjoyment rather than pressure
  - No heavy workload

## Grading

This is a low-pressure, enrichment-style course. No formal grades will be given unless requested by parents.

## Classroom Approach

Kids learn best through engagement and repetition. This class blends structure with fun—using music, movement, and creativity to help the language stick in a natural and memorable way.
